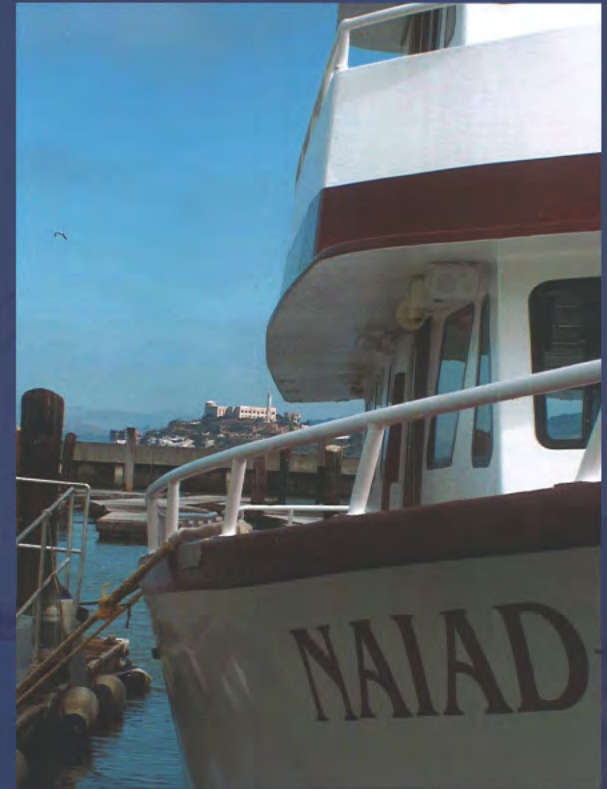


Scattering at Sea
